#### Message from the President

Hammock Dunes successfully weathered Hurricane Matthew, and our premier oceanfront golf community remains the "best place to live and play!" The HDOA's pre-Matthew beach dunes investments, including sand fencing, dune

planting and fertilization, paid off. The beach dune did their job and protected the Hammock Dunes community from Matthew's storm-surge flooding, unlike many other adjacent communities.

As a reminder, sand dunes are nature's "defensive attrition barrier", and Matthew's high wave action did create significant erosion of the beach side of the dunes while also damaging our dune walkovers. Therefore, we MUST restore our dunes to protect our premier community from potential future Matthew-like storms. The HDOA has developed a dune restoration plan and is aggressively engaging Flagler County and Florida state agencies and political leaders to help expedite the necessary restoration permits. Our goal is to start restoration of nature's valuable defensive dunes in December 2016 and complete the project before turtle nesting season begins in May 2017.

Our November 14th Matthew Town Hall presentations provide additional details concerning our plans for dune restoration and walkover repairs. I encourage all owners to go to HammockDunes.com and click on the Current Property Owners tab. Select the Hurricane Matthew Updates tab to view the Town Hall presentations.

I also would like to mention the Club's successful Links Golf Course renovation and the membership's approval to move forward with the clubhouse renovation project. Both of these Club initiatives directly benefit all Hammock Dunes owners by providing an enhanced community "first impression" for potential resale home and condo buyers and attracting new construction for our remaining homesites.

Again, restoration of our beach dunes is the HDOA Board's #1 priority while we continue to repair beach walkovers. Our objective is for all owners to continue to have the utmost confidence that Hammock Dunes remains the "best place to live and play."

Please enjoy this issue of *Inside The Gates*, and on behalf of the entire HDOA Board of Administrators, best wishes for a Joyful and Merry Holiday Season and a Happy, Healthy and Successful New Year. Thank you for your continued support.

The Declarant and Development Committee (DDC) advises the HDOA Board regarding the future development of Hammock Dunes. In this capacity, the DDC developed a multi-year, time-phased Strategic Growth Plan for Hammock Dunes and, with Board approval, continues to implement key components of this plan.

#### Recent accomplishments:

- Developed the review process for the DRC and the HDOA Board to approve owner requests to combine two adjacent lots into a single-home site, defined as Lot Binding in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment to the Ocean Estates Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs).
- Assisted the DRC in developing DRC manual guidelines, rules and restrictions concerning a home site's location and the physical home size associated with a builder/ownerLotBinding application.
- Coordinated July 14th joint HDOA/Club luncheon with WCI to discuss timelines associated with buildout of the two remaining condominiums on WCI's two vacant lots. WCI was very complimentary concerning the Club's renovation project as a selling point for their condo buildout, which remains in the next 2 to 5 years.

Current DDC members are: George DeGovanni (Chair), Bruce Aiello (HDOA-Treasurer), George Bagnall, David Eckert and Mike Gill with Travis Houk (SSMG) providing administrative support.

Security and Emergency Response

As we all know, Hurricane Matthew was a major event in October and a challenge for the Security and Emergency Response Committee. Two days before the storm, committee members met with the Flagler County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) to confirm the emergency plan and the mandatory evacuation procedure for the barrier island. The FCSO explained that when winds reach 45 mph (sustained), all bridges across the Intracoastal Waterway in Flagler County are closed. We were fortunate to have the United States National Guard outside our Main Gate and our South Gate as soon as the hurricane passed. Hammock Dunes had no security incidents during or immediately after the storm.

The Comfort Station (Lake San Gabriel) Walkover is now OPEN; however all of the other dune walkovers are CLOSED at this time...Please do not cross the caution tape since the walkovers may be unstable. We ask all residents to please stay away from the edge of the dunes and not to cross the dunes.

Thank you to all of the residents who have reported vehicles that are tailgating or front-gating. Your help is appreciated.

## Hammock Dunes Survived Hurricane Matthew

Hammock Dunes was one of the fortunate oceanfront communities that survived Hurricane Matthew without much damage. We were able to prepare and secure our structures and take direction from our local law enforcement officials. Since July, four homes in Island Estates were approved for construction, for a total of six in the community during 2016. Two major additions, two pools and a boathouse were also approved along with many other minor changes. The DRC has approved major updates of the five Design Review manuals – Granada Estates, the Villa communities, Island Estates, Grand Mer and the Playa del Sur/Camino la Mer communities. Final approvals are required by the HDOA.

Carsten George provides administrative support for to the group, which meets at 1:30 PM on the second Monday of each month.



**Maintenance**by David Yoder

Your HDOA Maintenance Committee has been very busy since the last issue of Inside the Gates. Addressing Hurricane Matthew damage and repaving some community roads have been our top priorities.

You're all aware of the damage caused by Hurricane Matthew on October 6th and 7th. Hammock Dunes was very well-prepared for the storm as a result of original construction planning and construction as well as ongoing maintenance, tree pruning and dune fertilization. Relatively little damage was done to our residential properties, but a great deal of dune damage, ocean side beach walkover damage and beach erosion occurred. The dunes, which belong to the HDOA, did do their job and protected almost all seaside properties from damage.

Immediately after the storm, a committee was formed to determine repairs and replenishment needs for the beach,

dunes and walkovers. That committee, led by David Eckert, Mike Gill and Bruce Aiello, has been very busy determining damage, funding methods, state, county and U.S. government requirements and possible financial assistance. A well-attended Town Hall meeting for property owners was held on November 14th to bring residents up to speed on the progress to date. There are two extensive documents about the status and plans for restoration of the beach, dunes and walkovers on our community website. By the time this issue of Inside the Gates is printed, one large community walkover should have been restored. The construction has begun on the walkover at the San Gabriel comfort station and will be completed soon so all can enjoy the beach again.

As a part of the Hammock Dunes Capital Improvement Plan, roads were repayed in Casa Bella and the Granada Estates neighborhood inside the North Gate. Any broken curbs were also repaired as a part of the project.

The large, bronze statue of a blue heron that graces our Main Gate entrance has been placed back in its correct position. It is on loan from notable local sculptor, Paul Baliker.

Security fencing has continued to be extended and upgraded, especially near the Main Gate. Painting and maintenance of street lights and landscape lighting is continuing.

Landscape refreshing and, in many cases, simplification to a more open and modern feel, is ongoing. Hurricane Matthew helped with the removal of any weak limbs or trees.

Planning

Earlier this year, we conducted a survey of new owners in Hammock Dunes who had made their purchase in the past couple of years. The purpose of limiting the survey to recent purchasers was to identify any changes in new purchasers from historic purchasers in the community. Twenty-five percent of the respondents were pre-existing residents who purchased additional properties during this time frame. These respondents are excluded from the following information to focus on those who are new purchasers to the community.

There were 54 individuals responding from 30 new purchases. Of the 54, 31 were under the age of 65 (22 under the age of 60). Interestingly, of 49 individuals responding to a question of employment status, only one identified as retired. The previous survey (2014) of all owners in the community found that when residents originally purchased in Hammock Dunes, 46% were retired, with 54% either fully or part-time employed.

The prior geographic residence location of new purchasers was consistent, though it changed slightly from the historic survey, as shown in the below chart:

Of new purchasers, 61% consider Hammock Dunes as their primary residence. Historically, 56% considered HD as their primary residence.

The top 6 reasons why respondents selected Hammock Dunes are as follows: (1) gated community, (2) ocean access, (3) direct ocean frontage, (4) property price to value, (5) landscaping, and (6) Hammock Dunes Club. Historically, the leading reasons are as follows: (1) gated community, (2) climate, (3) Hammock Dunes Club, (4) ocean access, (5) direct ocean access, and (6) property price to value.


